Group Discussion about what IS KNOWN about substance abuse issue in the Valley	<p>Highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Laura gave a short overview of the March meeting to get the group on the same page. ▪ Group reviewed the Healthy Youth Survey data. ▪ Friends of Youth shared that their data supports that there is a decrease in the perception of harm related to youth marijuana use. ▪ The group noted that there are barriers related to getting data about adult. ▪ Julie P noted that we need to keep in mind that most of what we are talking about really isn't something that has been changing or increasing over the years. ▪ The data shared left us wondering about what another community with our demographics without a drug-free community grant might look like. ▪ Sam B wondered about juvenile crime rates and how those related to the substance abuse data. Also, helps with prescriptions, bus rides, gas vouchers, food bank, energy assistance, eviction prevention, moving assistance, and family development. • Emphasis on building protective factors and reducing adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) • Personal accountability for being a positive influence
