1. Reasons for SFFC Use:

- Homelessness
- Medical and or hospitalization needs
- Substance Use
- Domestic Violence
- Incarceration

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- Overwhelm
 - Social Isolation – all families have in common I social isolation
2. Where the calls come from
 - Relatives or friends
 - Partnership with other social service agencies
 - Social workers
 - Churches
 - Schools, hospitals, law enforcement
 3. Goals
 - Intervene early
 4. Distinctives
 - Supplementary care not substitutionary care
 - Parents voluntarily request and retain full custody
 - Host families are volunteers and do not receive any financial compensation
 5. Fast Facts
 - Average length of stay 9 days
 - 98% are reunified with their family
 6. Host Family Approval Process
 7. Infrastructure of Safety
 8. Referral Process

Questions

1. Do you run a waitlist – How long does it take after a family reaches out for support? Depends on location and proximity to the host and family in need.
2. Do you have to be affiliated with a church? No, you do not.
3. Mosque or Temple that offers that program as well?
4. Support for language support?
5. Funding sources? – Funded privately
